According to the above proportions it appears, that the value of a *lb.* of silver is 62s. or 3l. 2s. and of a *lb.* of gold is 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ guineas, or 46l. 14s. 6d. Also that the *oz.* of silver is 5s. 2d. and the *oz.* of gold 3l. 17s. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. So that the value of the standard gold is 15 times that of the silver, and 1-14th more.

Of the ECLIPSES that will happen this Year,
1804.

WITHIN the limits of this Year there will be Four Eclipses, viz. Two of the *Sun*, and as many of the *Moon*.

The first is a partial and visible Eclipse of the *Moon*, if clouds cover not; and happens on *Thursday* night, the 26th of *January*. At the middle time of this Eclipse the *Moon* will be vertical in 19 deg. 32 min. of North Latitude, and 43 deg. 26 min. of East Longitude from *London*, which falls on the eastern coast of the *Red Sea*, on the borders of *Arabia*. From which it appears, that this Eclipse will be visible from the beginning to the end, to all *Europe* and *Africa*, and islands adjacent; and also to the greatest part of *Asia*. The *Moon* will rise eclipsed to some of the West India Islands. In this Kingdom, the time, and manner of appearance, may be expected according to the following Type and Calculation:

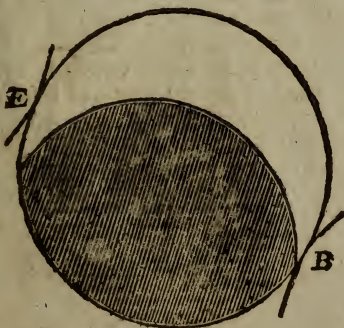
The Type for LONDON.



The Eclipse begins at *London*, at 58 min. past 7 at night; the middle will be at 7 min. past 9; when the digits eclipsed will be $4^{\circ} 44'$. as the Type sheweth; and the Eclipse will end at 17 min. past 10 o'clock, app time. At *York* it will be 4 min. and at *Edinburgh* 13 min. sooner. At *Lincoln* it will be 2 min. and at *Nottingham* 4 minutes sooner.

The second of these Eclipses is of the *Sun*, and is rather a notable one; it will happen on *Saturday*, the 11th of *February*, in the morning, and visible to us, if the air proves favourable. In the southern parts of *Europe*, and in the northern parts of *Africa*, this will be a very great Eclipse, in so much, that in 36 deg. North Latitude, and 6 deg. East Longitude from *London*, the *Sun* will be centrally eclipsed at noon day, and nearly, if not quite total. It will be a great Eclipse in *Poland*, in *France*, in *Spain*, and *Portugal*, at *Gibraltar*, and in the Mediterranean Sea. In the southern parts of *England*, the *Sun* will appear about three quarters eclipsed; but, in more northern situations, it will be somewhat less. The following Type is the appearance at the greatest obscuration at *London*, and may very well serve most of the Kingdom—under which is given the time of it, for *London*, *York*, and *Edinburgh*, from a geometrical construction.

The third is another partial Eclipse of the *Moon*, and happens on *Sunday*, the 22d of *July*; but it will be invisible to us According to the time at *London*, it begins at 52 min. past 3 o'clock in the afternoon; and it will be quite over at 10 min. past 7; which will be 44 min. before the *Moon* can rise. The Digits eclipsed at the middle will be near 11, on the *Moon's* upper limb. It will be visible in *New Zealand*, *New Holland*, *Van Dieman's Land*, and to most of the little islands scattered and dispersed in the Great South Sea. It will be seen in the eastern parts of *Africa*, and as far North as the *Red Sea*, *Arabia*, and *Persia*; in the eastern parts of *Europe*, even to the *Caspian Sea*, *Astracan*, and *Siberia*; also as far as *Russia*, where the *Moon* will be seen to rise eclipsed.

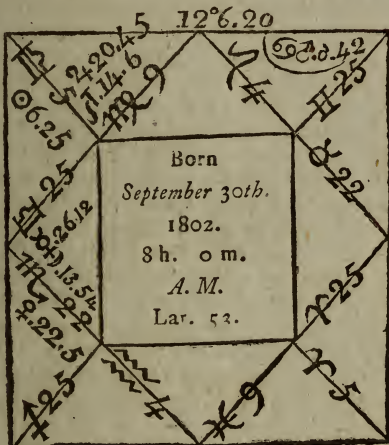
The fourth and last of these Eclipses is of the *Sun*, and falls on *Sunday*, the 5th of *August*, at about 4 o'clock in the afternoon; for the *Moon*, at this time having great South Latitude, which her parallax will also increase, makes it so, that the Eclipse cannot be seen in any part of these Kingdoms; but in the southern parts of the Globe, where the *Moon's* parallax diminisheth her latitude, it will be visible; even so much, that in Latitude 38 deg. South, and 66 deg. of West Longitude from *London*, the *Sun* will be centrally eclipsed at mid-day, and nearly total; this place falls in *South America*. Therefore, in those parts, it will be a very great Eclipse.

GENETHLIACAL ASTROLOGY.

THE Nativity of an Infant that was drowned at seven months old, investigated by my ingenious friend Mr.

JOHN WORSDALE, of *Donington Northorpe*, near *Boston*,
Lincolnshire, and communicated to me.

The HOROSCOPE at BIRTH.



This Nativity I have here given for the examination of the curious, it being (beyond all dispute) a most remarkable constitution for violence, and such as manifestly forebodes a violent death, which may be clearly observed by those who think proper to pay strict attention to the rules laid down by the great PTOLEMY relative to that important subject; though I am concerned to say, many are yet guided by those absurd whims yet in fashion, delivered by some Authors of antiquity diametrically opposite to the Quadripartite. Those Writers, I say, frequently select *Ascendant* for Hyleg, even if the Luminaries are found in the proper aphetical places, and by altering that nimble mathematical spot, they can presently find out the time and quality of Death; but this seldom happens with those who adhere to these principles, till the whole business is finished, and Death has taken possession; indeed, the baneful rays of ♃ or ♆, will, according to their

doctrine, perform wonders, particularly if those Planets have great dignities in the 8th House, which is the House of Death; but this is not all, the Dragon's Head and Tail will sometimes kill by their method and way of practice, which seems not a little astonishing to me, and at other times the hostile rays of ♃ and ♄ together will not be able to do the business; thus being foiled out of measure by a multiplicity of errors, they fail of success; therefore we may readily judge of the utility of such an improbable doctrine, Now, in making a few observations on the foregoing Figure, respecting Death and its quality, I shall strictly adhere to PTOLEMY's Precepts without the least evasion; and first then, I take it for granted, that the Moon is the true Hyleg in this Figure, being constituted to that office by her being in that part of the Ascendant that is prorogatory, or within the compass of her double Horary Times, according to the meaning of Ptolemy, in which position we find her greatly afflicted in a violent watery Sign, by the Zodiacal parallel of ♃, who is also posited in a Sign of the watery triplicity. The Moon is in * with ♃, but as this * is in Signs of long ascension, it is reputed a ☐ by Ptolemy, in page 146 of his Quadripartite, and doth naturally indicate violence; he also selects the Signs which forbode Death by drowning; his words are these, " ♀ being joined to them (viz. ♃ and " ♄) Death will occur by Poison and Treachery of Women; in ♎ or ♋, or in moist Signs configurated to the " Moon, he will cause Death by Water, being suffocated " and drowned. He also says further, if ♀ give testimony to ♄, Death will ensue by Women, &c." There are many other violent configurations in the Figure, particularly the ☉ in malevolent ☐ to ♄, from cardinal Signs, &c. Thus we find the ☽ Hyleg, and the rulers of Death posited in the watry triplicity, and in those correct Signs selected by the great Ptolemy, which are indicative of drowning, and which really happened so fatal in the present instance. In the next place, I shall state the time of a person's Birth that is now living, viz. March 10, 1783, 10h. om. A. M. Latitude 53°. 2'. N. The ☉ in this figure is Hyleg, and must be directed for Death without question. I well remember it was expected by some,

that the ☉ to the □'s of ♃ and ♄ in the Zodiac, &c. would shew their effects in a very dangerous way. I acknowledge those directions to the ☉ were productive of a violent Illness, which put Life in danger for a time, but had not power to destroy Life according to *Ptolemy's* Doctrine. As to the Figure itself, I see nothing of *benevolent consequence* likely to result from the nature of some impending directions, but danger and disappointments. I conceive the effects of the Ascendant to the ♄ of ♃ and ♄ are not very far distant; but as this is only the estimate time, and *not corrected*, I would not place any particular degree of confidence in the time of Birth, it being a subject I may (God willing,) take into consideration at some future time.—N. Astrological Observations for the Year 1804.

THE WINTER QUARTER,

Or, *The Sun's Transit through ♄, ☿, and ♃.*

THIS Quarter begins on *Thursday, December* the 22d, 1803, at 36 min. past 5 in the Evening, at which time, 22 deg. of ♄ ascends, and 23 deg. of ♃ are on the Mid-heaven. The ☽ ab. ♄ ♃, ad. □ of ♀ et Δ of ♄. The Planets are all under the Earth, except the *Moon*, who is in ♃, the Ascendant of *England*, and dignities of ♄ angular, and located in the *Med. Cœli*; the Planet ♃ is in ♄, in the lower angle of the Figure. The positions at this Ingress seem to portend many eminent Councils and Consultations, held on affairs of very great importance to this Country; for we are still under the influences of the late great ♄ of ♃ and ♃ in ♄, which are ever attended with Discontents, Hurries, and violent Actions, with great Controversies and sharp Disputes; and also the configurations of the Planets during this Quarter, signify an interruption in Public Affairs, and obstruction to the advantageous Designs under consideration for the peace of Mankind, stirring up new ferments and heats in the Councils and Courts of Princes, tending to ruin and

confusion, and contriving Plots against the established Government in certain Kingdoms of *Europe*, and all these will be managed with great privacy, because of their subterranean position at the time of this Ingress; but God, I hope, will bless and preserve his most sacred Majesty and all the Royal Family, and direct and prosper the endeavours of the great Council of the Nation, and chief Men in Authority, in the suppressing of Vice, and the wicked designs of the Enemies of our King, and the United Kingdom of *Great Britain and Ireland*.

Thus doth the Starry Influence foreshew,
 What 'tis our Enemies are about to do.
 But if they any further progress make
 To gain their end, 'twill prove a dark mistake.
 But welcome better times in these our days,
 For which to God give honour, thanks, and praise.

THE SPRING QUARTER,

Or, *The Sun's Transit through ♉, ♋, and ♌:*

THIS Quarter begins on *Tuesday*, the 20th day of *March*, at 3 min. past 7 at night, when 15 deg. of ♄ culminate, and 11 deg. of ♌ ascend in the Latitude of *London*; at which time the *Moon* is ad vac. * ♃ et △ ☉ et □ ♃ et □ ♀. All the angles of the Figure partake of the four Cardinal Points, and the *Moon* again strong in the Med. Cœli, in her own domal dignities.— This position of the *Moon* represents the People of *England*, and an heroic spirit in the Nation, in uniting against the encroachments of the *French* Government; and if the War should be protracted to this time, it signifies, with other configurations of the Planets, the good success of the Arms of this Country, in opposing the domineering spirit of that Government; but I have some reason to hope, before this time, things may be settled on a more solid basis, than has hitherto been done—notwithstanding the approaching ♄ of ♃ and ♋, the 19th of *April*, and the ♄ of ♃ and ♋ the 27th of *May*. To be sure these are

angry positions, but I hope their effects will be remote from us; for they signify some great changes and alterations to befall some countries. At this Ingress \hbar is on the Ascendant, in g to the *Sun*, on the cusp of the 7th House; f is in c of g in K , and near a \ast aspect of q , in the 6th deg. of g . These aspects will greatly contribute to the temperature of the season, causing plentiful falls of rain and fruitful showers; yet the weather will be unsettled and various; perhaps *April* more windy and moist; *May* more cool and dry than the former months.

THE SUMMER QUARTER,

Or, the Sun's Transit through z , q , and m .

THIS Quarter takes place on *Thursday*, the 21st of *June*, at 50 min. past 4 in the Afternoon, at which time the 11th deg. of m culminates, and the 21st deg. of m Ascends. The *Moon* ab. Δ q ad. g of g et \ast u et \square \hbar . From the positions of this Ingress, I judge, or conjecture, that the general affairs of *Europe* will be managed with great policy and privacy, also there will be eminent councils and debates about matters and things that relate to kingdoms and nations, and particularly concerning War or Peace; but I hope it may be the latter, for this is a more mild pacific Ingress than some of the former; however, it will in some measure soften and alleviate the evil Genii of the Times; and, I make no doubt, but there will be a strong inclination in most of the *European* powers for Peace, or to preserve it, should it be already made:—*St. Austin* saith, it is not sin to make War, but to abuse it. *David* was a great warrior, and God gave him a good testimony. And *St. Ambrose* saith, he that maintaineth a War against bloody and barbarous Enemies is a righteous person, for that he thereby defendeth the weak, and such as are subject to oppression. But it is God that governs the world—it is He that can command Peace or War, Plenty or Scarcity, &c.; it is his providential Hand that can secure and protect our guilty land, that

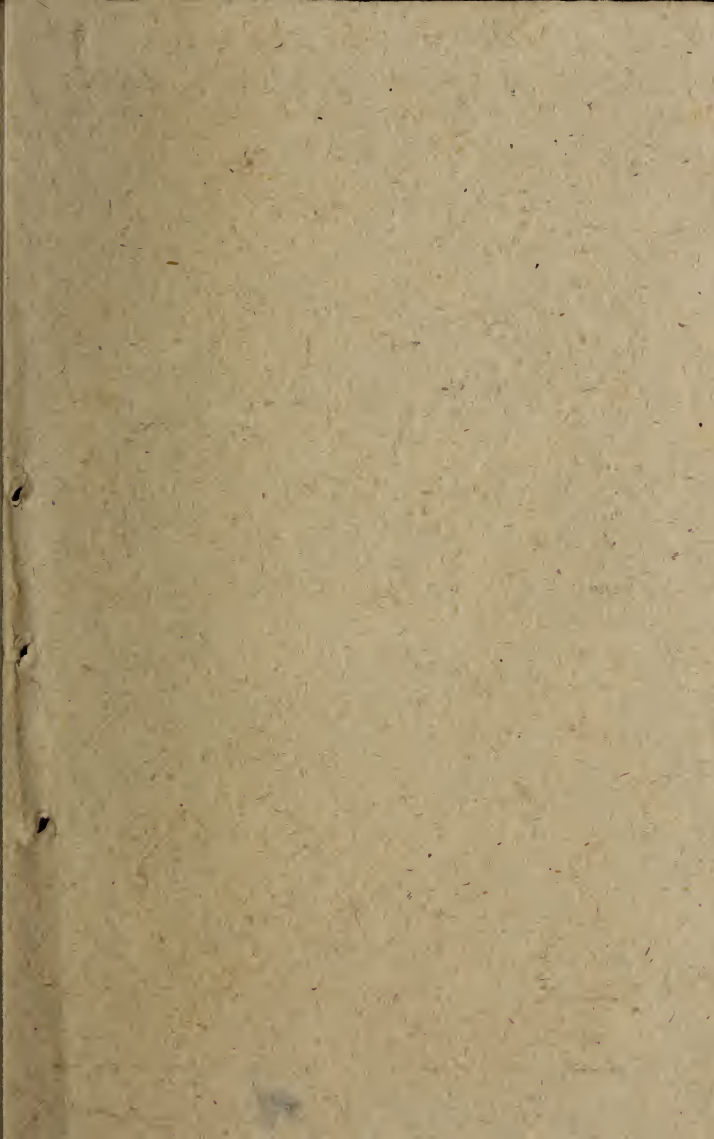
can preserve us from those imminent dangers that have of late, and, perhaps, at this time, may threaten our Country.

THE AUTUMNAL QUARTER,

Or, *The Sun's Transit through φ , η , and ζ .*

THE Autumnal Quarter begins this Year, on *Sunday* the 23d day of *September*, at 47 minutes past 6 in the morning, when 11 deg. of φ are on the Mid-heaven, and 8 deg. of φ ascend in the East. The *Moon* ab \square of φ et \ast ζ .—The Positions and Configurations of the Planets at the time of this Ingress will be followed with remarkable proceedings. We may expect to hear of great Discontents, Depressions and Impediments in Public Affairs, Murmurings and Insurrections amongst the common People, Robberies, Thefts, Plundering, and Rapes.—But I have reason to hope, in general, that a good state seems to attend the *British* Monarch's dominions, and whose Councils will be prevalent in the grand actions of *Europe*.
